## FRONT NINE

First Hole, 401 yards, down grade, rough on sides, green slopes to left, trapped on right, gully before reaching green.

**Second,** 403, slight elbow, direction flag 225 yards out, rolling fairway, gully 50 yards wide protects green.

Third, 463, long rough borders fairway, traps 180 and 200 yeards out on line with green which appears built up but is nearly level.

Fourth, 155, tricky mashie shot, green sloping to left guarded on upper side by traps.

Fifth, 356, drive and mashie shot to blind, unusually fast green.

Sixth, 168, up hill, green well guarded by traps.

Seventh, 454, well-trapped.

Eighth, 343, trap across fairway in front of green which slopes away.

Ninth, 390. JNarrow fairway, second shot up hill, traps and apple trees guard approach for 50 yards.

## **BACK NINE**

**Tenth,** 489, rough on left, out of bounds to right, fairway narrow and traps.

Eleventh, 382, chance to get into deep rough, terraced green.

Twelfth, 365, drive and pitch over long trap.

**Thirteenth,** 422. Long drive carries to top of hill, green lies below and seems lost among numerous well-placed traps.

Fourteenth, 138, one shotter to green like inverted bowl, trapped on both sides.

Fifteenth, 458, sharp dogleg, only hazard bit of rough.

**Sixteenth,** 196, one shotter but all carry, no hope for shot short or off line. Green on plateau surrounded by traps.

**Seventeenth,** 338, trap 225 yards out. Green trapped in front and on sides.

**Eighteenth,** 430, up hill and numerous traps scattered about to catch stray shots.
